
John Brown Watson Memorial Library System Fall 2022 Newsletter



GREETINGS, EDWARD J. FONTENETTE LIBRARY DIRECTOR

The 2020-21 academic year posed challenges for the Library and staff which I could not phantom—space reduction by 3/4, budget reduction by 50%, gross loss of staff, and other pandemic **bedevilments**. Nevertheless, a dedicated, loyal, and highly competent staff of professional librarians and paraprofessionals persevered. Their ingenuity, creativity, and innovation sustained excellent librarianship for the faculty, staff, and students at the

University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff.

Yet we maintain our high posture and profile with the National Medical Library, the Library of Congress, Arkansas Library Association, and the American Library Association. We played a decisive role in building a 13 million dollar County Library, conducted a virtual tour for the American Library Association (ALA), and enlisted a liaison status with the National Medical Library. I am extra-ordinarily boastful and proud that we returned to OCLC for our data management because we and our predecessors helped to create this global library management system.

The paraprofessional and professional staff of the John Brown Watson Memorial Library are second to none of all the library personnel. For their loyalty, hard work and dedicated service as is manifested over the 47 years of my tenure as Library Director, I am appreciative and grateful.

OCLC WMS IMPLEMENTATION 2022-23

The library replaced its ALMA Library Management System with OCLC WorldShare Management Services (WMS) for 2022-23. The WMS system is fifty-percent more cost effective and more conducive to a smaller academic library. WMS is a complete cloudbased library management platform, has a user-focused experience, and an API-first framework. WMS provides a more user-friendly cataloging platform for resources added. STAFF DEVELOPMENT @ THE LIBRARY

During the summer 2022, I was afforded the opportunity to publish an article within the Arkansas Libraries Magazine for the Arkansas Library Association entitled, "Encouraging Staff Development: Secretary to Associate Library Director". This article discussed the importance of encouraging staff development to improve knowledge and skills in the workplace for continuous improvements to services.

The library has set a standard for staff to complete staff development trainings each month. We began our staff development by cross-training all staff within each department of the library. These cross-trainings provided staff with improved knowledge regarding what services are provided within each area of the library system to better serve patrons. When staff are aware of what services are available in the library they can better serve and refer patrons calling or visiting the library on a daily basis.

Staff also view online development trainings in relation to their library duties and customer service. Good customer service to patrons is one of our greatest assets. We strive to promote better interactions with students and other patrons. The library has implemented increased visibility of staff by requiring staff to perform frequent contact with students asking if they need assistance and providing that assistance if needed. We do not wait for the student to come to us we go to where they are within the library. We have already experienced improved interactions between students and staff this semester. Staff have reported less student conduct issues since implementing more interactions.


Stress-Free Fridays @ the Library

Shenise McGhee was a speaker at the Arkansas Library Conference 2022 in Fort Smith, Arkansas.

The Intellectual Freedom: Arkansas Perspectives Panel. This panel, composed of librarians from school, academic, and public settings, hopes to engage all types of library workers with experiences of challenges to intellectual freedom, how our panel participants responded, and what they learned. We hope participants in this session will listen to and learn from these case studies, but also will jump in with their own experiences and share how we can support one another throughout the state of Arkansas with a nuanced response to addressing these thorny issues. Shenise has served and chaired state and national committees such as the Arkansas Library Association's Intellectual Freedom Committee (chair), ALA's Office for Intellectual Freedom Committee (member), and the Gerald Hodges Intellectual Freedom Chapter Relations Award Committee (chair), as well as taking part in the IFRT Coalition Building Intellectual Freedom Table. Shenise received the Arkansas Library Association Intellectual Freedom Award in 2019 for her work with the ALA Office for Intellectual Freedom Working Group in the revision of the Interpretations of the Library Bill of Rights.

TRUTOUCH Interactive Display

The Interactive Display is a touchscreen board that allows groups to record meetings and give presentations. When the user touches the screen to begin the board automatically starts recording. Some features include a white board, which allows you to write on the screen while using other apps, and a built in

computer for surfing the web. For presentations, the display has a HDMI port to connect to your laptop. Two boards are located in the BLRC meeting room and outside near the tables for use. Another is located in the Word Instructional Resource Center (WIRC) in the Education Department. When finished with your meeting you can either save your recording to a USB or delete it. An instructional training video is available on Niche Academy.
