UAPB is the second oldest public institution of higher education in the state. Founded in 1873 as Branch Normal College, it has a rich history and is now a part of the University of Arkansas System. The University offers more than 50 undergraduates degrees, including Regulatory Science degree, and three graduate degrees—Education, Aquaculture Fisheries, and Addiction Studies.

Responsibilities include teaching elementary and intermediate Spanish courses, serving on department/school/university committees, and mentoring students. The teaching load is 5 courses per semester.

Qualifications include a Master's degree in Spanish with at least two years of college-level teaching experience; excellent written and oral communication skills and the ability to work well with students and colleagues from diverse backgrounds, ability to integrate technology into the teaching process and/or teach in a variety of modes, and a commitment to teaching excellence.

The salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience.
