This proposal is a request to change the name of the Broadcast Journalism Option in the Mass Communications Program to Multimedia Production. The Multimedia Production Program will have to options – Broadcast News and Broadcast Production. The program is seeking accreditation from the Accrediting Council on Education in Journalism and Mass Communications (ACEJMC), the agency responsible for the evaluation of professional journalism and mass communications programs in colleges and universities worldwide. In order to achieve ACEJMC accreditation, we are proposing that we change the current curriculum for Broadcast Journalism to meet ACEJMC standards.

Students in Multimedia Production will have to take 27 hours of core courses and choose one of the following options:

4. Objectives:

- (a) Students must take a minimum of 72 semester credit hours (or 104 quarter credit hours) required for a baccalaureate degree outside of journalism and mass communications and meet the liberal arts and sciences-general education requirements of the institution. ACEJMC expects at least 95 percent of the graduating classes in the two academic years preceding an accreditation visit to meet these requirements.
- (b) The unit provides a balance among theoretical and conceptual courses, professional skills courses, and courses that integrate theory and skills to achieve the range of student competencies listed by the Council.
- (c) Instruction, whether on-site or online, is demanding and current, and is responsive to professional expectations of digital, technological and multimedia competencies. Achievements in teaching and learning are recognized and valued.
- (d) Student-faculty classroom ratios facilitate effective teaching and learning in all courses; the ratio in skills and laboratory sections, whether on-site or online, should not exceed 20-1.
- (e) The unit advocates and encourages opportunities for internship and other professional experiences outside the classroom and supervises and evaluates them when it awards academic credit. Schools may award academic credit for internships in fields related to journalism and mass communications, but credit should not exceed six semester credits (or nine quarter credit hours).

We believe that the proposed curriculum meets the standards set forth by ACEJMC.
