The cost to the students for a six-hour internship course, relative to the instructional experience provided, is not consistent with other internship opportunities offered at UAPB. Additionally, it was found that at other institutions where there were similar programs of study, internship courses were typically offered for 1 to 3 credit hours. Only at institutions where internship classes could be taken multiple times, were credit hour totals of up to 6 hours found. It is the belief of the faculty in the department of music, that this adjustment provides our students with a greater educational value and a more consistent educational experience across campus programs.
