

## FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

# SUMMER 2017

The Intent to Register form for Summer 2017 is available on the Financial Aid page on the web under Forms. It can be accessed through Current or Future Students and may be completed by students who want an assessment of federal financial aid available to them for the summer term.

Federal loans are subject to annual and aggregate maximums, therefore the amount borrowed, if any, during the 2016-2017 academic year as well as in prior years could affect eligibility for loans during the summer. A student must enroll in at least six (6) hours total in order to be eligible for a federal student loan (this can be in either Summer I or II or the two sessions combined). Students who intend to enroll in both Summer I and Summer II must register for all classes for each session by June 12, 2017 in order for the hours to be considered in determining maximum federal financial aid eligibility.

A student who remains registered after being deemed ineligible to receive federal financial aid remains responsible for paying all charges unless satisfactory payment arrangements, which may include other sources of financial aid, are made during the summer term. Payment or satisfactory payment arrangements for summer charges must be made according to the following:

- *The final date to satisfy payment arrangements for Summer I 2017 institutional charges is June 6, 2017.*
- *The final date to satisfy payment arrangements for Summer II 2017 institutional charges is July 11, 2017.*

The University reserves the right to disenroll a student for failure to satisfy payment arrangements. If such right is exercised administrative announcements will be made.

A student who withdraws from Summer I must notify the Student Financial Services in writing if there is an intent to return for Summer II. Any student who is enrolled in Summer I and Summer II and decides not to attend Summer II is advised to withdraw from or drop Summer II while still enrolled in Summer I (at least 2 days before the end of Summer I). This guidance is given in an effort to prevent federal funds being returned on behalf of the student due to federal student aid withdrawal guidelines (R2T4).-

Financial aid and student account information will be communicated through UAPB email and WebAdvisor. Students are advised to keep abreast of information that may affect their status.
